The public art is funded through a small surcharge on certain county construction projects and does not involve taxpayer funds.

The steel and enamel sculpture entitled, Candy Splat, by multimedia artist and New City resident Doris Laughton was installed across from Building D at the county office building.

The refurbished wood and concrete bus shelter was originally designed and installed in front of Building A in 1990 by Pomona artist Bill Hochhausen. After falling into disrepair, the shelter was recently restored by Bill Hochhausen.
